

Concept for Discussion:

Qualifications for a Provisional License



- (A) The Board may issue a provisional license to an unlicensed chiropractor or chiropractic student currently matriculated within an approved chiropractic program and where the unlicensed chiropractor or chiropractic student does not meet the requirements for licensure described in [Sections - reference]. Examples of a provisional license may include, but not limited to, a chiropractic student undergraduate or graduate participating in a college preceptorship program; a chiropractor in an established travel-to-treat arrangement; and emergency care in response to a declared disaster.
- (B) A provisional license:
- (1) shall be issued under procedures set forth by the Board;
 - (2) shall include a description of the purpose for the license, and the specified period or day(s) that the license would be active;
 - (3) shall not be issued for a period to exceed six-months from the date of issuance;
 - (4) may contain restrictions as to the time, place, or services that can be provided or required level of supervision by a licensed chiropractor which the Board deems appropriate; and
 - (5) may be summarily revoked by majority vote of the Board at any time without a hearing.
