DRAFT Patients' rights

- 1. To know who treated them and in what capacity / To have a way to contact the chiropractor in the future if needed
- 2. To be assured the chiropractor is qualified to treat them, maintains malpractice insurance
- 3. To receive care within the chiropractor's skills, training, and scope of practice*
- 4. To a reasonable examination
- 5. To understand recommended treatment, risk, expected outcome, alternatives, consequences of no treatment
- 6. To know what was done / To have the chiropractor maintain record of care
- 7. To understand recommended follow-up if indicated
- 8. To have their information kept confidential

*(whichever is stricter – license jurisdiction or temporary location)

DRAFT Patients' responsibilities

- A. To supply contact info
- B. To reveal pertinent health history
- C. To provide access to records of previous health care if applicable and practical
- D. To follow up if recommended

Agreement by all that field care has certain limitations as opposed to in-office care
